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Why Consider Change?

- Provide categories in which respondents can "see themselves"

Combined race/ethnicity question

Current Two Question Approach

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Combined Approach

100	write in the specific race(s) or origin(s).
	White — Print origin(s), for example, German, Irish, Lebanese, Egyptian, and so on.
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	Black, African Am., or Negro — Print origin(s), for example, African American, Haitian, Nigerian, and so on.
C	Hispanic, Latino, or Spanish origin — Print origin(s), for example, Mexican, Mexican Am., Puerto Rican, Cuban, Argentinean, Colombian, Dominican, Nicaraguan, Salvadoran, Spaniard, and so on. Z
C	American Indian or Alaska Native — Print name of enrolled or principal tribe(s) example, Navajo, Mayan, Tilingit, and so on.
(Asian — Print origin(s), for example, Asian Indian, Chinese, Filipino, Japanese, Korean, Vietnamese, Hmong, Laotian, Thai, Pakistani, Cambodian, and so on. Z
(Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander — Print origin(s), for example, Native Hawaiian, Guamanian or Chamorro, Samoan, Fijian, Tongan, and so on. Z
0	Some other race or origin — Print race(s) or origin(s).

NCHS Concerns

Trends

- Small population sizes
- Mismatch between numerators provided by states in vital records and denominators provided by Census
- Amount of race data imputed
