Evidence-Based Policymaking Commission Act of 2016

- Bipartisan:
 House Speaker Paul Ryan, Senator Patty Murray
- Enacted March 30, 2016
- Commission consists of 15 appointed members
- Operational support provided by Census Bureau
- Commission terminates September 30, 2017

Purpose of Commission

- Improve the use of data by the government for program evaluation and federal policymaking
- To this aim, the Commission will:
 - Consider the current use of data, research, and evaluation to build evidence
 - Identify ways to improve and strengthen evidencebuilding in the Federal government
